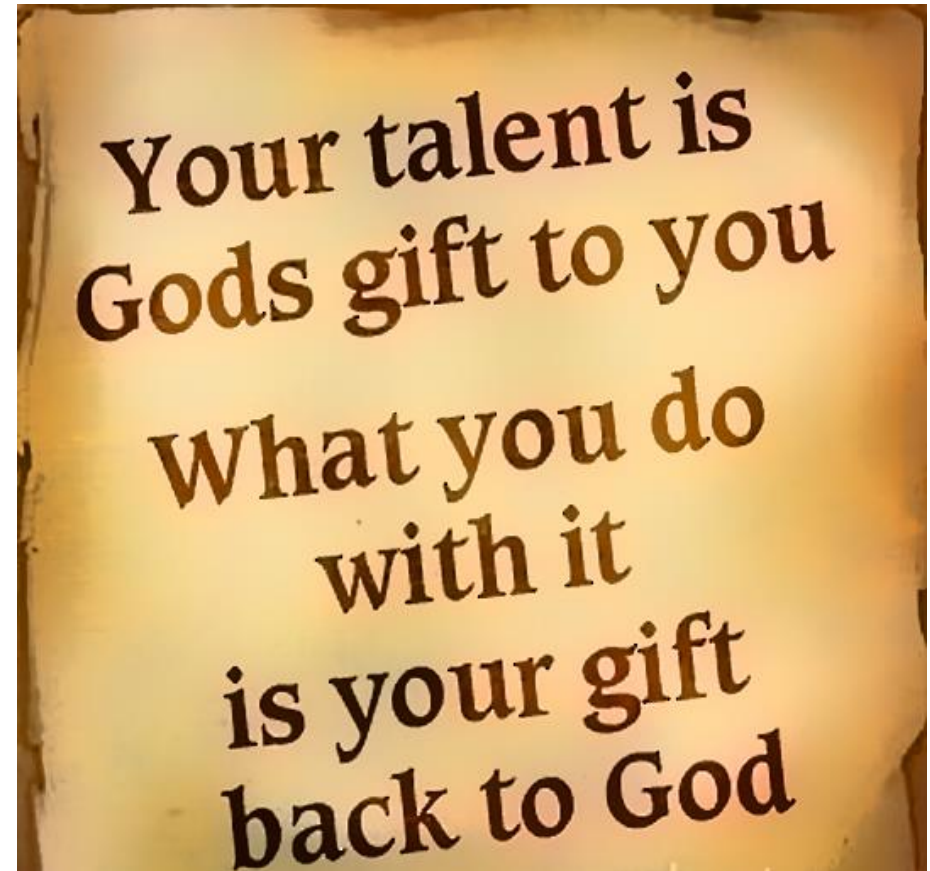

to before winter temperatures set in. Volunteer labor is lined up to handle those needs. Since Mennonite Church USA, specifically Mennonite Education Agency, does not have the funds for this unexpected cost I am hoping southeast Iowa Churches will be able to help. The immediate need is for funds to pay for the LP Gas needed to fill the tanks and keep the furnaces running at above freezing temperatures where needed. Winterizing will be done for water lines where possible, but some of them need to be heated to above freezing temperatures. Other needs that are not considered an emergency will be forthcoming. A separate fund called "Hopi Mission School" is set up with Mennonite Church USA. If your church can be of help with these needs, please send your contribution to Mennonite Church USA, 718 N.
